Sports Funding Evaluation 2015–2016

Below are some of the objectives we aimed to target with our Sports Funding budget. Below the aim, are the results we had by the end of the academic year and the impact that it had.

Objective

Fees to Dartford District School Sports Partnership events

Money Spent: £45

This has allowed teams to take part in football tournaments and cross country festivals. It also enables the school to develop contacts with other school PE subject leaders sharing ideas with each other.

<u>Objective</u>

Tennis coaching and future development of hiring more coaches for other areas of the curriculum

Money Spent: £2610

Working with JG Play Ed, a coach worked alongside staff to deliver PE sessions once per week, as well as lunchtime active sessions with KS2 pupils. Staff chose areas of PE that they had found difficult to teach in the past e.g. Tag Rugby – the representative from JG PlayEd planned the lessons, giving the staff confidence in being able to deliver an aspect of PE that they struggle with.

Pupils enjoyed the PE sessions more and were able to demonstrate the skills taught effectively. Staff recorded in questionnaires that they felt more confident in their ability to deliver PE sessions.

Objective

Gymnastics coach in working with YR and further future development of team teaching to enhance Improve the skills and confidence of staff to deliver high quality training sessions to improve the delivery of PE/Sport

Money Spent: £1460

Gymnastics CPD was arranged for the teaching staff from Val Sabin; this included looking at how to use the purchased updated manual to effectively plan and deliver high quality gymnastic sessions. Overall, the staff felt more confident in their ability to deliver gymnastics session to their classes.

A KS1 gymnastic workshop was funded by DLJ – this supported both staff and pupils in their participation in gymnastics in school.

Objective

Fund after school clubs to ensure all learners have access to a variety of sporting events

Money Spent: £134.92

This money was spent on ensuring we have staffing with sufficient subject knowledge to run a netball club.

This ultimately ensured that we could enter a netball team into tournaments as well as a run an inter-school netball tournament in the summer term.

<u>Objective</u>

Sporting experiences outside school including travel to venue e.g District Sports

Money Spent: £250

This enabled children to attend a cross country competition at a local school as well as a netball tournament by providing transportation to these events.

Objective

Enrichment days for different types of sports e.g archery

Money Spent: £1670

This paid for the following:

- KS2 Archery workshop in which all KS2 pupils were able to work alongside a professional archer to have a go at archery, in turn allowing for new experiences to occur for the pupils.
- EYFS/KS1 circus workshop this allowed children to experience a range of fundamental skills involving throwing, catching, spinning and juggling.
- KS1 Athletics KS1 pupils were transported to and from a local athletics club to experience a range of athletic activities.

Other uses of sports premium funding:

- £444 to promote healthy eating in KS2 purchase of fruits for younger classes in KS2 to continue the momentum from free fruit in KS1.
- £142.99 to purchase equipment to enable high quality PE provision in school.
- £225 purchase of football kits to enable school football team to represent the school at matches and tournaments.
