Dear Parents/Carers,

We used this opportunity to remind children of the importance of demonstrating respect to one another no matter what gender, religion or race we are and we were able to remind children that the Craylands School does not accept bullying, including racial bullying, in any shape or form.

When teaching a Year 6 e-safety session last week, through a discussion on apps that they know of, they informed me of an app called 'omeagle'. After investigating, this app sounds very dangerous—it enables people to speak to complete strangers via a web cam; this obviously poses many risks. Please do check that your child is not using this app.

I am aware that there has been a lot of sickness amongst the children of late, however we need to ensure that as much as possible, our children are sent into school. When a child misses a day from school, this can have a detrimental effect on their understanding of any work that they are given when they return. I will be sending out letters at the end of this term to those pupils whose attendance is becoming a concern.

Reminders!


I am seeing too many children wearing trainers to school currently—this should not be the case.
