Dear Parents/Carers,

I am sure that you will agree the children have taken part in a wide range of creative activities; it was great to see many of them acting, reading aloud and presenting their work in front of an audience. Many thanks must also go to the staff for planning such a broad and balanced curriculum for the children.

The children looked fantastic in their book related costumes, whilst learning about life as an author and finding out about the books she has written. They have produced some fantastic work, based on a book called 'Journey'. It has really hooked the children's imaginations. Big thank you to Mrs Bricher for organising the week—prizes will be issued next week for the top writers in the school.

The new 'Reading Around the World' reading scheme was started this week. Your child needs to read at least 10 minutes per day to travel onto the next destination on their maps. We look forward to issuing the first certificates for those who reach their next continent. Reading is so important for any age group - please support the school by ensuring your child reads regularly.

Has your child been part of Lenny's pride yet? A new initiative, to ensure the children take as much pride in their work as possible, has been launched in the school. Staff are looking for children who have clearly shown pride in their work - these will then receive a 'Lenny's Pride' certificate.

Next Thursday is parents evening. Throughout the evening, as well as having an opportunity to look at the children's books, I will be asking parents/carers to complete a questionnaire so you can share your views on the school - what we are doing well and what you would like us to continue to improve.


