Dear Parents/Carers,

We are close to the end of another term—the year certainly seems to have flown by!

Next week, we will be holding our ROAR (Respect Others Act Responsibly) assemblies; by now, you should have been informed whether your child will be receiving a reward or not. To ensure we maintain our high standards of behaviour, this term we have decided that not only will those who have received too many consequence cards and/or warning cards for unkind behaviour, we will also not be presenting ROAR awards to children with warning cards reaching double figures.

As a headteacher, I do not feel that it is fair to give ROAR awards to those who have remained 'green' for the whole term, alongside those children who continue to receive 'warning cards' for not following the golden rules or who have been spoken to on numerous occasions by me about the way they behave with their peers—we have to be sending out the right messages to all of our pupils, that of a high expectation of behaviour. I know that this may be upsetting for some of you, however I do appreciate your support in this matter.

This week saw Mrs Cox and Mrs Grasby hold the second of their maths workshops; many thanks to all parents and carers who attended the KS1 and KS2 workshops. From the feedback we received, we hope to be able to deliver further workshops on areas of maths as well as other subjects in the future.

The parking zone continues to run, however I am aware of some parents arriving earlier than the gates open and parking up on the zig-zagged lines to drop their children off. This is dangerous and can cause congestion on the road. We endeavour to open the gate just before 8.40 and it is open until the gate closes at 8.50; this is plenty of time to drop your child off. I would ask for users of the drop off zone to time the journey so that you get to school just after 8.40 ensuring that you do not cause any issues on the surrounding roads. Many thanks in anticipation for this.

We have noticed that some of the girls in the school, particularly in upper KS2 are wearing long socks; whilst we do not have an issue with this as such, we would request that they do not wear them above the knee. If they are feeling cold, they should either wear tights or trousers. Thank you for this.

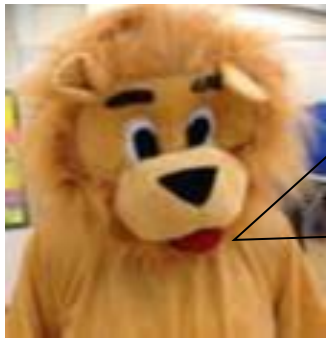
- Please ensure your child has their PE kit in school; they are able to wear jogging bottoms and a long sleeve top for outside games.
