Dear Parents/Carers,

I urge the parents and carers of those in our reception classes to ensure the children are in as much as possible, as there are many children whose attendance has fallen between 95% and 90% which needs to be improved. Thank you in anticipation.

On Monday, I am holding a parent session on home learning. Many thanks to those parents who have emailed me with their opinions—I appreciate this, as I know that not everyone is available on Monday morning. I will consider sending out a survey to gather more views on this subject, if I do not feel that I have a general consensus from those who attend on Monday.

I have been made aware that there are some of you who continue to use Facebook to discuss and make comments about the school. May I remind you that if you have an issue or a concern with the school, the best thing you can do is to ring us or make an appointment to speak to us. We are always willing to listen and support.

Can I kindly ask that those parents who have begun to use the car park and drop off zone at the end of the school day not to—this is only to be used by those who have agreement by me for medical reasons. Without staff supervision, there is a real health and safety risk. Thank you for your support in this.

Tomorrow, we have our annual summer fayre. Starting at 12pm the fayre will have all the usual inflatables, fun stall and BBQ. Can I thank all those parents/carers who have volunteered to support during the day, as well as all of the staff who are giving up part of their Saturday to help raise as much money for the school as possible. I shall see many of you tomorrow and the sun hopefully too!

Reminders!

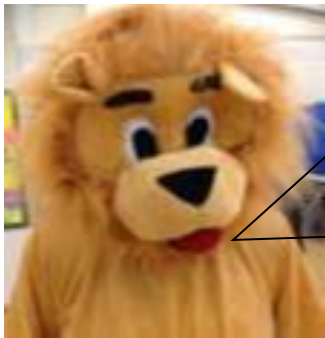
- Please ensure your child is wearing school uniform every day—no trainers please!

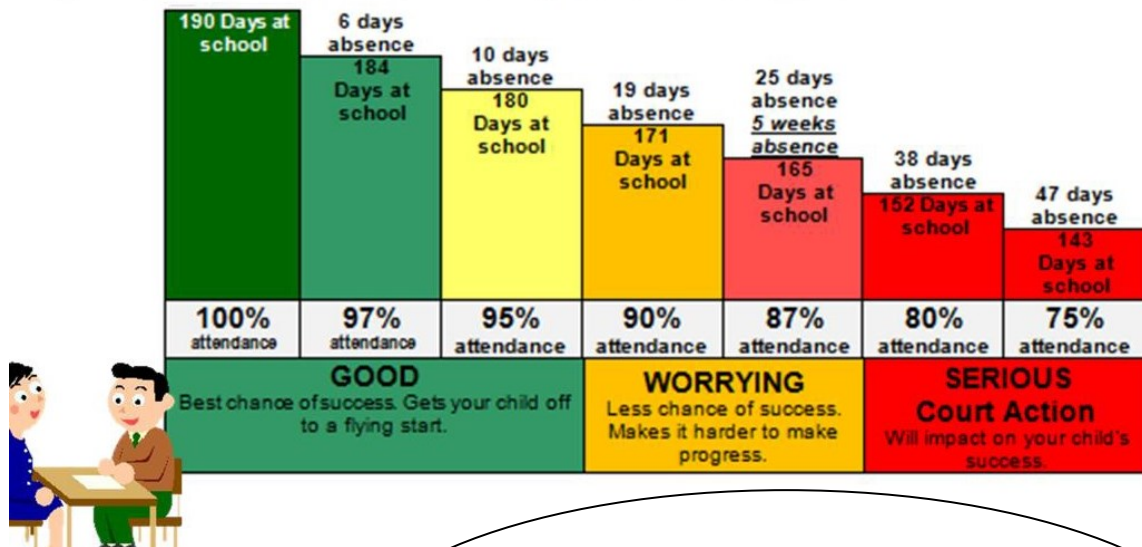
