School Meals!

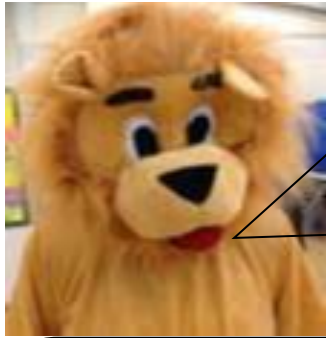

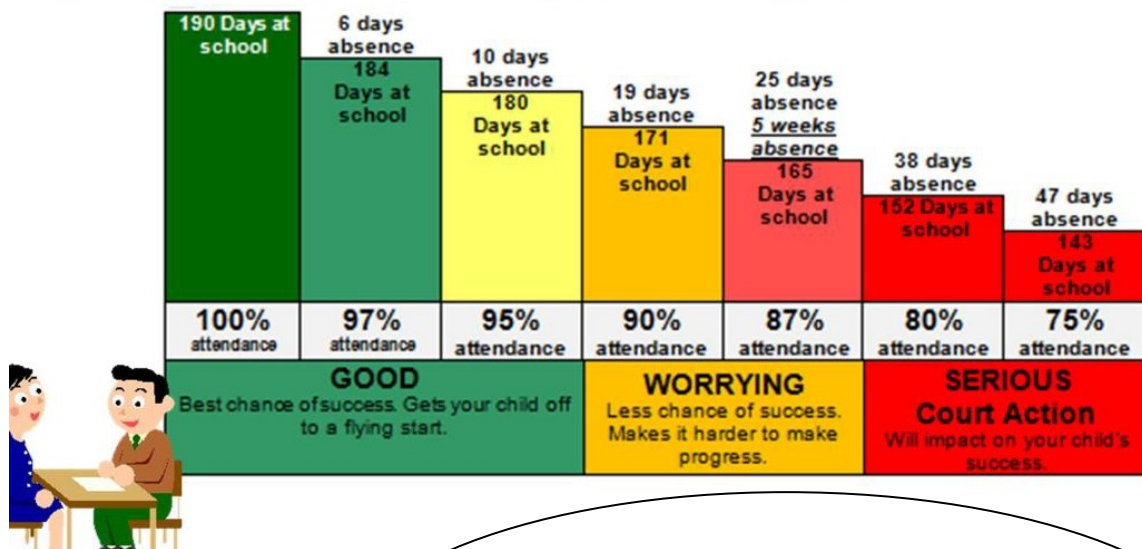
