Dear Parents/Carers,

A big milestone for any year 6 class on their transition to secondary is the completion of SATS week. It's over Year 6...hooray!! I would like to say how impressed I have been with the maturity and calmness that every single one of the Year 6 children has demonstrated this week. They have taken risks, they have made mistakes and then learnt from them in the tests, they have used resources to help them in maths and have listened to last minute revisions hints and tips. You couldn't have a better example of Craylearning than what they have demonstrated this week. We are all very proud of you and whatever the outcome, we know that you have all tried your absolute best and that is all we can ask for. Well done!

The hard work doesn't end there however. Mrs Bishop still has a whole month to make her teacher assessed judgements in reading, maths and particularly writing. As there is no SATS test for writing, it is down to Mrs Bishop to make a judgement, therefore the children still need to put every effort they can into their work whilst they are at Craylands.

Year 2 have also been working hard in their SATs over the past couple of weeks; Mrs Grasby has carefully planned the best time for the children to take their assessments and these too are working incredibly hard, putting lots of effort in and demonstrating those Craylearning skills. Keep it up for your final assessments Year 2; just like Year 6, they also need to continue to work hard, as Mrs Grasby only uses the SATs to guide her overall assessment of how the children have attained...keep up the learning in your reading, maths and writing.

All the other year groups are working just as hard; the effort that the children put into the other year groups, really helps to prepare them for these end of key stage assessments so it is really important that they keep using resources, ask questions, take risks and learn from their mistakes—just as Lenny the lion wants them to.

Next week, the new data protection guidelines come into place; yesterday, you should have received some documentation regarding consent for various things. It is so important that these forms are returned to the school within the next week, so that we are compliant with this new legislation. Thank you in anticipation for your support in returning the documents speedily.

It's been lovely to have Mrs Dymott with us again this week supporting with SATs; she will return fully from her maternity leave in June.

I had a tour of the new building this week; it really has come along. I could quite easily envisage the classrooms, group rooms, changing room and toilet that have all been planned from the boundaries that have been installed. We still hope to be able to use enough of the new build, if not the whole building, for KS2 come September.




