Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back to term 6—the final term of this academic year and the final term for our Year 6 children.

This week, we had our information session for our new EYFS pupils starting in September. We look forward to welcoming them to the Craylands community.

The expansion has continued, despite some very wet weather last week. I am aware that the building is unlikely to be completely finished in September, however I have been assured that we will be able to use enough of the classrooms for our KS2 children in September. We will make sure that there is a back up plan if this does not happen so that the children will have somewhere to be educated when they return.

This week, I have attended a couple of very important courses. The first was a safeguarding refresher course. Mrs Cox, Mrs Drake, Mrs Stone and I are the school's designated safeguarding leads. It is our duty to lead on safeguarding across the school, to ensure that all of our children are safe. After my refresher, I am pleased to say that we do a very good job at safeguarding the children at our school. Sometimes, this does cause conflict between us and parents, especially if a child has made a disclosure which we need to seek advice on, sometimes resulting in support from children's services. We have a duty of care to all children in this school and have policies and procedures that we must follow. I'm sure that you will appreciate that we will endeavour to do whatever we need to, to ensure the children are safe—even if this means making a referral about one of our families.

On a similar note, you also have a duty of care for not just your own children but all children in our community. If you see something happening in the local community that you feel is not right, it is your duty to report to the relevant authorities—please don't wait to come and tell us, expecting us to do it; the best thing you can do is to report it yourself; the facts are always better when they come from the person who has seen what has happened first hand.

Please share with your children that if they ever feel unsafe, in or outside of school, they can come and talk to myself, Mrs Cox, Mrs Stone, Mrs Drake or in fact any adult in the school, as we are all trained in safeguarding (just not the leads).

The second course was on GDPR; I'm glad to say that we have made good progress towards this. The privacy policy is on the school website and we are looking closely at procedures in school to ensure we keep personal data safe and secure. Those people who haven't sent back your GDPR consent forms, please do so as soon as possible. Thank you.

The children still have 6 weeks to make lots of progress in their learning; as I've said previously, term time holidays should not be taken—yet I have been inundated this week with holiday requests—these will result in applications for fines. Please ensure as much as possible that Year 1 are in every day next week, as they are taking part in the phonics screening checks—thank you.

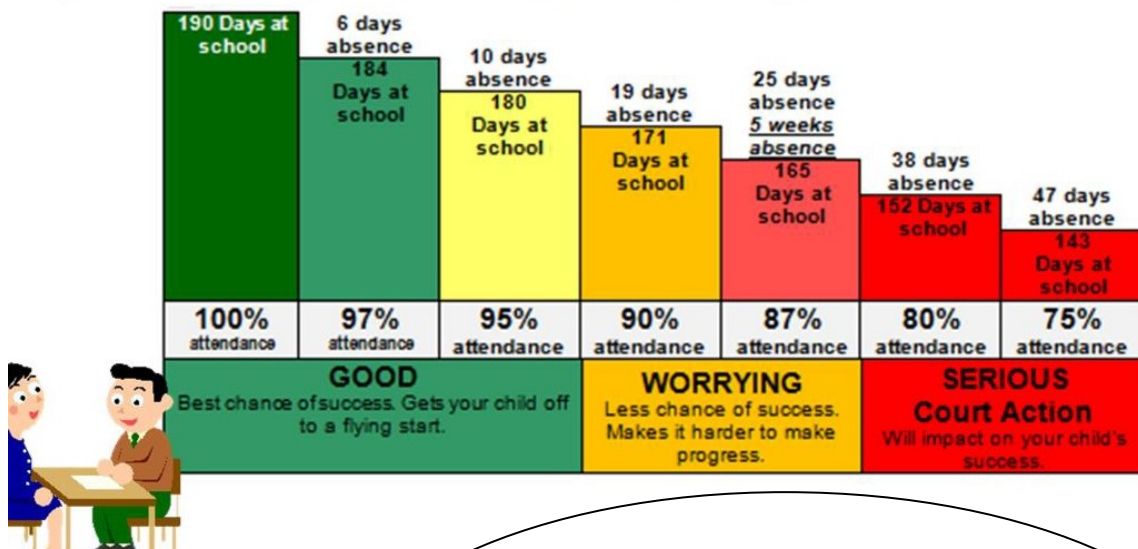
