Dear Parents/Carers,

We have a busy few weeks ahead with lots of exciting events including residentials, productions and sports day.

With some of these events, we can often see an increase in incidences amongst the children in terms of behaviour—something that we have definitely seen this week. There seems to have been an increase in children not following the school rules and not demonstrating respect to each other. It is very important that, as a school, we maintain high standards of behaviour right until the end of the school year; it is also important that you, as parents and carers, support the school in ensuring your child understands what is right and what is wrong in terms of behaviours in and out of school. If they have received a consequence card or are on the sad face, please do discuss, as I know many of you do, the reasons behind it and how they can avoid receiving them in future. By working together, we can make sure that the children enjoy the last part of this academic year. Thank you.

Could I kindly request that parents and carers watch their language when on the school site; whether this is through jest or anger, we would not expect the children to use such language so we do not expect our parents to.

I'd like to praise the Year 1 children this week for trying their very best with their phonics screening test. Whilst we do not know the pass mark yet, we know that every child did their very best and that is all we can ask of them. If they haven't made the expected standard, there is nothing to worry about—it means that they will need further intensive phonics support in Year 2, in preparation for a retest. Thank you to Mrs Stone and Miss Blamires for making the children feel comfortable when taking part; also thank you to Miss Blamires, who through her thoroughness, ensured that when we were visited by an inspector on Monday, they were very impressed with the way that it was run.

On Monday, I took a number of Year 5 and 6 children to a small school football festival; the team of girls and boys won 2, lost 2 and drew 2. They ended joint third in their group and they had fun.

Next week, many of the Year 4 children are on their residential, in Ashford. They are due to take part in many exciting activities including archery, abseiling, zip wire as well as the leap of faith. We ask that they demonstrate the skills of Craylearning by taking risks, not worrying about the activities and never giving up. They will all face their own personal challenges, whilst having lots of fun.

As a result, I will not be in school between Monday and Wednesday next week due to attending the residential with the Year 4 children. If there are any concerns that you may have, please don't hesitate to speak to Miss Blamires (our deputy head) or a member of the Pupil & Parent Support Team, who will do all that they can to help. I would ask that you try to make an appointment to see them, rather than expecting to see them on the spot. Thank you.

- Please do not allow your child to use the trim trail at the end of the school day.

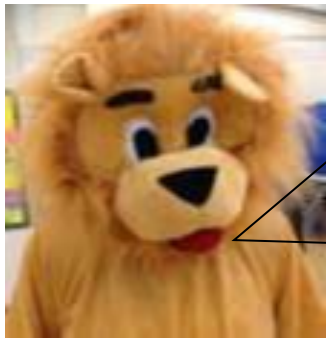
- Please DO NOT park in the car park at the end of the school day.

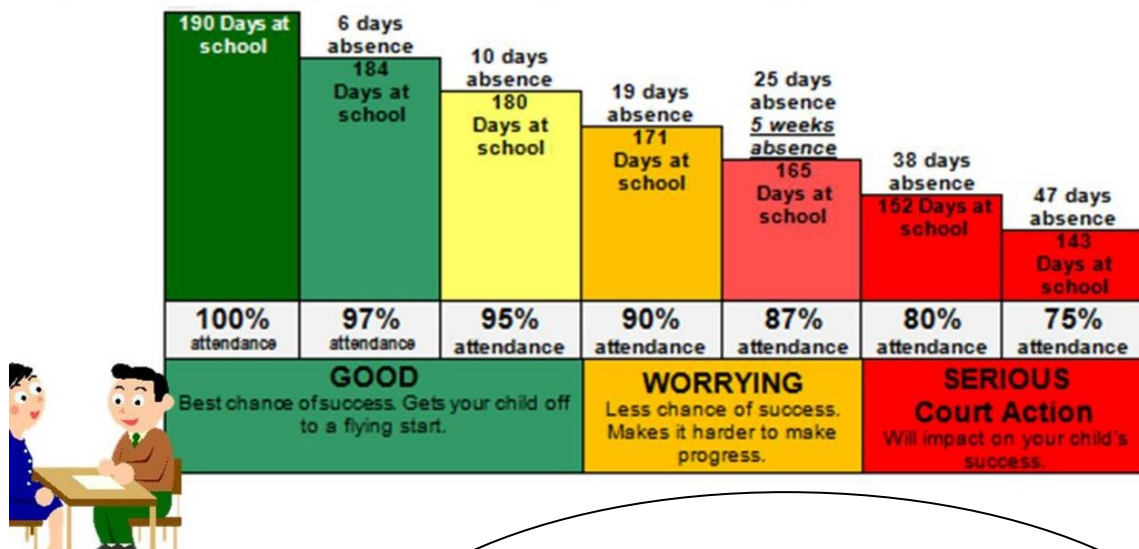
