- Children are expected to be in school 100% of the time. Holidays will be unauthorised and possibly result in fines.


- Don't forget to get your ticket requests into the School Office (aka The Box Office!) for the KS2 production.

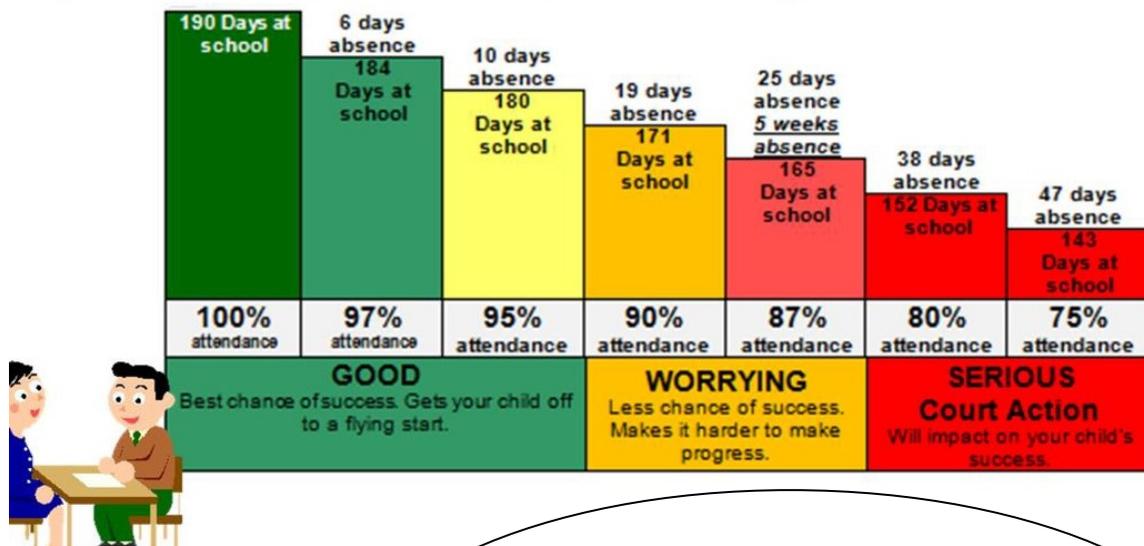


Achievements outside of school...
