Dear Parents/Carers

The children have all started their first topics in literacy, numeracy, science and STAR of this academic year—a successful first full week.

Many thanks to all those parents and carers who attended the welcome evening on Wednesday this week. As I explained at the meeting, I really want to build on the community that we have here at Craylands and include you, as parents, more in school life. This was the first opportunity of the year and it was great to see so many of you—we also appreciate the many apologies that we received, as this shows that you care about your child's education but were just unable to attend. For those of you who missed it, I will be putting up the power points used throughout the evening onto the school website.

During the evening, I discussed that I would like to review the behaviour systems within the school, with particular focus on the R.O.A.R. assemblies. Many of you took home a questionnaire and hopefully copies were sent home to KS2 at least yesterday. Please do complete it and send it back, so we can review whether the R.O.A.R. assemblies should continue in the way that they currently run. Thank you.

Mrs Drake has arranged the opportunity for parents and children to attend the Cyclo Park at a reduced price during the INSET day on 1st October; if you are interested, please do request a space on the coach through the school office.

This week, I met representatives from the local council regarding the parking concerns that many of you have. We surveyed the surroundings of the school and they have said that they will return after school one day to see some of the issues we currently have and may have in the future as we continue to expand. One of the key messages that came from the meeting was that we need to encourage as many of our families to find alternative methods of getting to school rather than driving. As part of our school travel plan, we also need to ensure we are promoting walking to school as the best option in reducing traffic on the surrounding roads. I hope we can work together to promote walking, using the scooter and cycling as the best methods of transport to and from school.

Club lists were sent out this week with the majority of staff running an after school club; those not able to run a club after school, will be running sessions during lunchtime, however these are not on the club list and children will not have to sign up to them. I have attempted to arrange for some sports coaches to come in to deliver some more sporting clubs, however I have been unsuccessful in this currently but will continue to seek someone. There will be other clubs returning later in the year including the popular 'Change for Life' club.

Early this week, a number of boys and girls from year 6 made presentations in front of SLT explaining why they would make a great head boy or head girl. It was a very difficult decision as there were some great speeches made. We are pleased to announce that our head boy will be 'Tony' and our deputy head boy will be 'Leo'. Our head girl will be 'May' and our deputy head girl will be 'Chloe'. We congratulate them and all the other nominees, who I'm sure will fulfil other important roles including team captains and monitor roles; these will be delegated by the end of next week.

Please do not allow children on the trim trail at the end of the day.




Lenny's letter



To be a Craylearner, you need to be in school every day!


