Dear Parents/Carers,

Another week has flown by—how is it the final week of this term next week?

This week started very successfully for the Years 5 and 6 boys football team who travelled to Princes Park community pitches to play against Dartford Primary Academy as part of the Dartford District League. It was a great match with some excellent football from everyone. The team managed to secure a 5-1 win! They have yet to lose a single match this term—here's hoping that they can continue with this record when they compete in the National League Trust 6-a-side cup on Monday. I shall keep you updated!

Coming up next term, we have more matches, Futsal tournaments, Sportshall athletics and Boccia to take part in—we will try to include children from across the school.

Next week, the staff will be making assessments of the children in Years 2 to Year 6; you will receive an end of term report on their attainment. We have only been back in school for 6 weeks, so please do not be surprised if your child has remained at the same stage as they ended on last year—it can take time after the summer holidays for the children to re-consolidate what they learnt last year and learn and understand new concepts taught. We will of course identify any child who needs further support and plan appropriate interventions for them. Year 1 will get their first report at Christmas, as the children have only just started accessing the curriculum so the assessment will be more accurate at the end of term 2.

Yesterday, I carried out snagging on the new building with the local authority. I am pleased to say that upstairs is almost complete with the exception of some small minor fixes. We are hoping that the MUGA pitch, which was due to be started this week, will be created next week and that the building will be handed over before the half term.

Over the weekend, there are 6 car park spaces being painted in the drop off zone. These spaces will only be available to be used after 9am as if cars park in them before this, we will not be able to safely use the drop off zone.

Next week, we will be opening our doors to parents and carers on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday for our reading mornings. Please come in through the main gate with your child and walk round the their class—sign the register and then spend some time reading with your child. Also on Tuesday and Thursday, the after school teacher led clubs are open for parents and carers to come along and join in. We look forward to seeing many of you at some of these events next week.

Funnybones class have their class assembly on Thursday at 9am. Harvest Festival is later in the day but is for children only—please do donate food items beforehand.

Individual school photos are on Monday; if you have not completed a GDPR form stating your child can have a photo, then they will not have one taken. If you are uncertain, please write a letter in stating you are happy for your child to have their photo taken.


Info and Reminders!

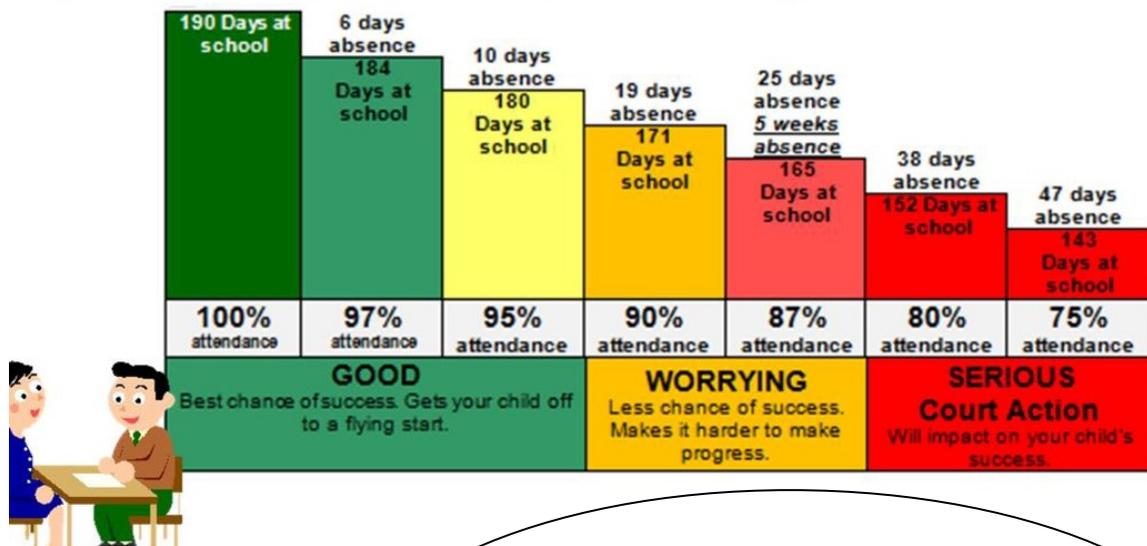


Achievements outside of school...
