Adjectives: (prefixes and suffixes)

Prefixes can be placed at the beginning of some adjectives to give them the **opposite meaning**.

Sailing is legal.

Sailing is illegal.

Suffixes can be placed at the end of some nouns to turn them into **adjectives**.

There is danger in smuggling.

*It is a **dangerous** occupation!*
