Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back to term 4....I hope that you had an enjoyable half term break and enjoyed a week of not being the teacher.

Return to school update

I am sure that many of you were pleased about the announcements made earlier in the week related to the gradual easing of lockdown; it seems as if we are moving in the right direction. Part of that easing is the reopening of schools to everyone again from 8th March. Whilst we understand that many of you may still have reservations and anxieties, the government's expectation is that ALL children, apart from those who have been advised to shield by a GP, should attend school from 8th March.

As a school, I can assure you that nothing has really changed since your child was in last. The most noticeable change is that staff are now wearing face coverings in the more communal areas eg corridors, staff room, office and at times in the classroom and on the playground. All other routines and procedures remain in place and you will have received guidance on this hopefully (if not, you will do shortly).

First day back—art well being day

The arts are a fantastic tool for supporting well being and mental health; they have a strong impact on a community feel and can take away any anxieties over the fear of not being able to do it. On the first day of term, we will be using resources from 'Place 2 be', a children's mental health website to deliver art activities, which will also allow the children to think about their emotions and feelings. We hope to then be able to display as much of this art around the school as possible to brighten it up and celebrate that we are all back together again.

Literacy first week

In literacy for the first week back, we will be looking at writing a poem based on our remote learning experiences. This is part of the Dartford Football Clubs verse competition. It will allow us time to discuss with the children their experiences of remote learning and how it feels to be back in school. We will also be promoting neat handwriting and presentation during this process, hopefully again displaying many of the poems around the school.

ST-ART weeks

The afternoons of the first couple of weeks will be focussed on either art or DT (there may be some other learning before this part of the afternoon). There will also be PE taught.

We hope that with these plans, we can ensure your child re-engages with school life, enjoying it, feeling happy, safe and ready to learn.

Please do continue with your child's remote learning for the remainder of the time they are at home. We understand that remote learning remains challenging for all but please do encourage your child to keep being a Craylearner and complete some of the tasks set in their final week at home.

Have a lovely weekend all—enjoy any sunshine we may get.
