Dear Parents/Carers,

We are now at the end of term 5 and what a sunny end to the term it has been! A huge thank you to all staff and parents/carers who have supported the children in and out of school over this term. You are all heroes of lockdown!

School closure update

On Wednesday, I sent out a guide detailing the proposed return of EYFS, year 1 and year 6 from 1st June onwards. All week I have been working on risk assessments and guidance so we can follow the DfE and local authorities guidance on the re-opening, however we may still yet open up further as a final decision is not due until 28th May. I will of course update you all as soon as I know for certain our plans will go ahead.

I would like to acknowledge those emails I have received from those who are not sending their child back; thank you for these. I shall clarify some queries I have received since sending out the letter.

When is my child due back?

The children will return on the following days:

Monday 1st June—Key workers in years 2, 3, 4 and 5

Tuesday 2nd June—Key workers in above year groups, EYFS and year 1

Thursday 4th June—All of the above and year 6

When your child starts, they will be in full time. Please note, we can not keep any EYFS child later than the collection time on Fridays.

Can they wear uniform every day?

We have deliberately altered days they are wearing uniform as we need to be certain that they are wearing different clothes from the day before. Also, if they wear PE kits they can take part in activities outside. This is direct from guidance so supersedes the fact that you have uniform you want your child wearing every day.

Can they bring hats and water bottles in?

Yes most certainly as they will be outside lots in term 6. However please DO NOT send them in with a bag. We will not be using cloakrooms at all. Can we request that trainers have Velcro on them where possible for EYFS and Year 1.

Now some questions I need to answer clearly for you:

What happens if the teacher is ill?

That class will be closed until the teacher is well again. I have no further staff to cover classes I'm afraid. We will of course let you know as soon as we know we may have to close a class.

What happens if the plans do not work?

Until we see things in action, I have no idea as to whether what I have placed on paper will work. If it does not, I will have no qualms but to reduce the number of children we have in school. The government would like us to focus on EYFS and year 1, therefore I must warn that year 6 would be the year group we would stop from coming in.

Will you open for other year groups?

Whilst the government want us to be in groups of 15, we simply won't be able to. I am using all my available teaching and support staff to cover EYFS, year 1, year 6 and the key worker groups which now make up 2 groups.

We have some challenging weeks ahead of us and I hope that I can count on your continued support; the emails this week I have received have been greatly appreciated.

School will remain open during the half term for key workers, however the phones will not be manned. Any urgent issues please email me or contact the school mobile on 07541591749
