Dear Parents/Carers,

We are approaching our penultimate week of this academic year and the children remain focussed and are working hard.

Next year

As I sent out yesterday, we will continue to follow the current Covid guidance until the end of this academic year. We will over the next couple of weeks, review the procedures we have in place now and those we had in place pre-Covid and provide you with information regarding how things such as collection and drop off will run from September onwards. Please do remember that we have grown as a school since we were running as 'normal' so there will need to be changes made.

New classes

Your child will have been given a letter today which informs you of the staffing structure for next year and what class they will be in and who their teaching and support staff will be. The information related to the class your child will be in is on the top of the back page.

We have some new staff joining us in September. Miss Cole will be joining us in Year 4 in the morning so we can split the year group 3 ways for literacy and numeracy. Miss King will be joining us as a new teacher in Year 2. Miss Livermore will be joining us to cover PPA and leadership time in Year 2 mainly. We will also be joined by Ms Stripe and Mrs Slater as new Midday Meal Supervisors. We look forward to welcoming them all to the team.

This year, we have mixed EYFS and Year 1 children. The decision to mix was not made lightly and we strongly believe it is in the children's best interests. Staff worked closely together to ensure that the classes were a fair mix. Please do respect the decisions that have been made; whilst it may be tempting to complain, I can assure you that lots of consideration has been taken and any movement away from any friendship groups may very well be to ensure that your child is able to focus fully in lessons, which is what we want. They will be able to play with their friends at playtimes and lunchtimes.

Your children will have the opportunity to meet their new teachers on Monday 12th July and Monday 19th July, between 1.30p.m. and 2.30p.m. We hope this supports the transition process ready for September. Sadly Miss Livermore can not make these.

Year 6 residential

I had the absolute pleasure of joining the Year 6 children on their residential this week. They were fantastically behaved and a real credit to the school. They had lots of fun and laughter; they used Craylearning skills throughout challenging themselves and being resilient. I hope they are able to take away the skills they have developed to support them with the transition to secondary school. I am writing to you today, to ensure that you all have plenty of notice for the activities suggested.






