Dear Parents/Carers,

A huge welcome back to you all—it was fantastic to see a steady stream of children flowing through the gates this morning, looking so smart, with smiles on their faces and ready to learn.

Hakuna Matata

For the first time in a long time, I was able to hold a KS1 and a KS2 assembly in person today. The children were AMAZING! They came into the hall without talking and sat wonderfully! I admitted to them that I was a bit worried about what they may be like and I was very pleasantly surprised. Worries was the theme of the assembly, as it is only natural that we all felt a little worried this morning.

'Hakuna Matata'...it means no worries—this has been the phrase of the day! Throughout this year we will be working on developing the social and emotional learning of our children, developing self-regulation skills. The use of creative and arty activities is incorporated within this, which is why the children have been working on some 'Lenny the Lion' or 'Westie the well being sloth' crafts today, which will be added to a whole school display in the main entrance.

We want to embrace 'Hakuna Matata' in the sense that we want to recognise we all have worries but it's finding out how we can seek support to make those worries go away. We hope the children enjoyed these craft activities. It links nicely with the Craylearning skill of 'Never worrying about making mistakes'.

COVID

If your child has Covid symptoms, they should not come into school and should have a PCR test done; we will send home anyone we feel has symptoms. Children can come into school if there is a household member with Covid eg siblings, parents etc however we would be grateful if you could tell us that there is someone at home with Covid, so that staff can take any precautions they may need to. A letter from Lenny

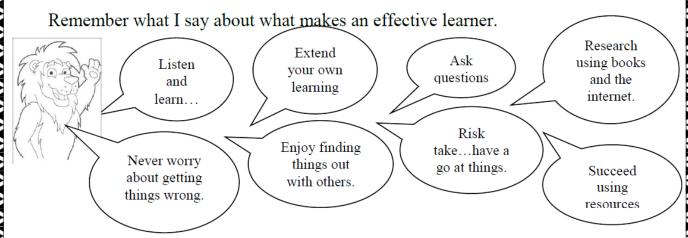


Welcome back! Your class adults are excited to share the next school year with you!
