Dear Parents/Carers.

I managed to spend some time in KS1 this week, practising phonics with some of the children and looking in their books; I can see that they are working so hard on presenting their work neatly and showing how much they have been learning. Well done and keep up the hard work KS1.

Football

This week has seen the first football tournaments of the year. On Monday, boys from years 5 and 6 attended the Dartford District 7-a-side tournament. They played against 3 other schools in their group, performing extremely well indeed, not conceding a single goal in all of the matches and winning every single one. They have now made it through to the finals on Friday; we wish them all the best and who knows by the time you receive this newsletter, they may have come back trophy! On Wednesday, girls from years 4 to 6 attended the Dartford District Girl's 7-a-side tournament. This was the first time that many of them have played in a game like situation against children from other schools and I was so very impressed with how well they adapted and progressed in their understanding of tactics, skills and positioning throughout the games. They came 2nd overall in their group and should feel very proud of their performance.




