Dear Parents/Carers,

Happy New Year....I hope you managed to enjoy the festive break and that Covid did not manage to ruin your plans and you got the opportunity to spend some family time together.

Covid

A new year but we are still very much in a pandemic and there are a number of children off currently after testing positive over the Christmas break, with some children still awaiting PCR results—any confirmed PCR results from children who have been in school, I will of course let you know.

Last night, there were changes announced to the use of PCR tests. From 11th January, next Tuesday, anyone including children, who tests positive on a LFD test should begin their 10 day self isolation—they do not need to get a PCR test to confirm. On day 6, another LFD test can be taken and if negative, a further test should be taken 24 hours later on day 7. If this is negative, you can leave self isolation earlier. If day 6 is positive, you should take it on day 7 and 8 and if negative, you can leave isolation. We would suggest that you take the test early on day 6 so that if it is negative, you can take another early on day 7 and if that is negative, your child can return to school on that day. However, if your child is still exhibiting symptoms on days 6 and 7, they should not return to school until the 10 day isolation has ended.

If you or your child exhibits symptoms, you should still get a PCR test instead of using an LFD test.

If you are ever in doubt, please make contact with us and we will do our best to advise.


