### Maths Home Learning at Craylands:

In the next few weeks, children in the Early Years, KS1 and those in the juniors who need it will be receiving log in details about how to access 'Numbots' to develop their early understanding of number and their number bonds at home.

The building blocks of understanding Mathematics and mastering the Primary Mathematics Curriculum are: developing a sense of number, knowing all of the pairs of numbers that make each number up to 20 and applying this knowledge to larger numbers and having rapid and accurate recall multiplication and division facts. Therefore, it is vital that children practice this knowledge at home on their written homework sheets and spend at least 15 minutes practising on the TTRS or Numbots Websites or APPS each week. Please see the table below that clearly sets out the linked National Curriculum Expectations for each year group:


