Match report: Craylands vs Bean - K.O - 3pm - Tuesday 8th February 2022

Our first match of 2022 started off with a bang, beating our opponents Bean in the Small School FA Cup 8-2.

This was round 2 of the cup due to the previous school pulling out of Round 1. A team with a couple of debutants, Owen and Albert were strong from the first few minutes with multiple chances coming our way. Albert, who was participating in his first game, had the first couple of chances which were saved and sent wide.

It took about 8 minutes for the first goal to go in with the ball coming loose on the wing, Zach picked it up and placed the ball in the bottom left corner of the goal. Another went in a couple minutes later, Harry being the scorer. Our debutant Albert was next on the score sheet placing it through the legs of the goalkeeper to make it 3-0. 1 more goal went in before half-time, Mark swivelling in the box and placing it in the bottom left corner.

As the second half kicked off, we continued the scoring. Luca got himself on the scoresheet lifting a ball into the corner of the goal, making it 5-0. Another lovely goal was scored again closely after with Harry getting his 2nd of the game placing the ball into the corner of the goal. Bean continued to fight on and managed to get themselves a goal with a lovely shot from the wing into the top corner of the net making it 6-1. A wonderful through ball from Albert set Mark away on goal, who smashed the ball into the corner of the goal making it 7-1

Bean were still pushing and managed to grab their second goal of the game when they slotted the ball past the reach of Ernie in the corner of the goal. The scoring still not finished, with Luca sending a cross into the box which looped over the goalkeeper and into the corner of the goal - he will say he meant it... Final score 8-2.

I was really impressed with the great sportsmanship and teamwork throughout. Thank you to all the parents for bringing the boys down and cheering them on throughout the match.

<u>Match report - Thursday 10th February - Craylands vs New Ash Green - K.O: 3:30pm</u>

Craylands School produced another solid victory on Thursday 10th against a strong New Ash Green team. The scoring began after just 2 minutes when Harry crossed the ball which looped over the head of the goalkeeper, off the post and in. Another play down the left produced goal number 2 with Faren finishing from close range. The game settled down after this with both teams producing chances. Craylands's goal number 3 came just before half time from a well worked set piece. A short free kick from Harry into Luca, who struck the ball which deflected into the corner of the goal. However, moments later, New Ash Green struck back, scoring from a well-worked corner. Half time: Craylands 3-1 New Ash Green.

Both teams began sharp from the kick off, however it was Craylands who continued their scoring. Another well taken free-kick was parried from their goalkeeper, but sharp movement from Mark managed to finish off the loose ball. Goal number 5 came from another corner, Luca finishing off the loose ball in the box. However, at 5-1 the game wasn't won. Two mistakes from the back gave New Ash Green a way back into the game, making it 5-3.

Luca was on the score sheet again a few minutes later, striking the ball from distance. The shot unfortunately going through the legs of the New Ash Green keeper. With 15 minutes left, New Ash Green managed to claw another goal back from a corner, making it 6-4. The game felt very tense at this point. However, as New Ash Green were pushing forward, Craylands were able to capitalise. A shot from distance, parried by New Ash Green's keeper gave Luca his hattrick as he picked up the loose ball and fired it into the corner. Goal number 8 came in the final minutes. Great pressing from the front allowed Crayland's to pick up the ball high up the pitch. Another parried shot fell into the path of Faren who was not going to miss. Final score: Craylands 8 - 4 New Ash Green.

Once again, the children showed great respect and sportsmanship throughout, the ref complementing them on this at the end of the game. Thank you to all the parents for bringing the children down and cheering them on throughout the game.


