Bridge building

This week, Years 5 and 6 were visited by Bridge 4 Schools; their aim is to give the children an insight into Civil Engineering and encouraging their interest in the practical application of STEM subjects.

Their flagship activity was the 'flat-pack' 13m long cable stayed bridge that the children constructed, walked across and deconstructed. The children also created bridges using K'nex in a classroom workshop.

The children showed Craylearning skills by listening to each other and enjoying working together, using team work and problem solving skills. Thank you to Mrs Francis for arranging this activity.

Finally, it was lovely to have the morning workout on Tuesday and welcome parents to stay and play again.






