Young Voices

Last night, the Year 6 children attended the Young Voices concert at The O2 arena. Joining hundreds of children from other schools, they sang and danced to the songs that they have been learning all year, as well as having the opportunity to watch some other amazing artists on the stage. A big well done to them all for all of their enthusiasm and hard work in learning the words (I didn't have the song words with me—promise!) and a thank you to all those parents/carers who were able to attend to watch. We hope you enjoyed it and joined in as well. Thank you to the staff who attended, as it is a late night and we appreciate your time in giving the children this opportunity.

Earrings

My reminder last week has had little impact as I have continued to notice children wearing hooped earrings or earrings shaped as animals etc. I would like to remind you that earrings should be small, flat studs—the reason being is that these do not run the risk of being caught on anything during play times. We will need to start sending out reminder slips to parents/carers regarding this if your child continues to wear them to school.

Watches

I have seen lots of conversations between other headteachers recently regarding the watches that children are wearing to school. Modern watches certainly have become a lot more than just being able to tell the time and whilst currently I do not have an issue with the wearing of smart watches to school, there have been times, when I have been teaching, that I have seen them becoming a distraction. If your child does have a smart watch, I would encourage you to ensure that all functions related to sending/receiving messages, access to internet, taking images are switched off and in fact if the watch has that capability, it poses too much of a risk being in school, so your child should not wear it. Watches that track fitness and steps etc pose no risk apart from being a distraction at times.

Children's Mental Health Week

From the week commencing 6th February, it is children's mental health week. The school will be recognising this with a number of activities throughout the week. We would like to culminate the week on 10th February with a 'Dress to express' day, where we encourage the children to come into school dressed in a way that expresses their own personality and character—they can of course just wear their own clothes if they would rather. Face paints and hair colouring is fine for this day also.


