

Governor Vacancy

Being a governor can be one of the most rewarding roles that you'll ever have. By becoming a governor, you can help to influence the direction of the school, impacting on all of the children's learning at the school.

Who can be a governor?

Governors come from all different backgrounds but have one thing in common—they care enough to want to make a difference to the children at the school. A governor can be anyone with an interest in the school and does not have to be a parent or carer of a child but could be a family member, friend or member of the community.

What commitment do I need to make?

There are 6 evening meetings per year to attend usually between 6.30p.m. and 8p.m. Governors receive documentation 7 days before these meetings, which they should read and either send questions beforehand or prepare them for the meeting. As part of the role, governors work in pairs to carry our monitoring by visiting the school and speaking to school staff.

Am I skilled enough?

All you need to be able to do is read and understand the documents given to you and be willing to ask questions, challenging and supporting the school. There are plenty of training opportunities for new governors—in person and online.
