Welcome back to term 4—I hope that you had a restful half term.

ST-ART week

As you may have seen in the ST-ART newsletter, the children have been busy in their ST-ART week this week. In our ST-ART week, we start the term off with an art or DT focus. This term the focus has been on DT and the children have been learning about the following:

Year 1—have been making houses; learning how to create hinges and joining materials together.

Year 2—have been learning about healthy eating, designing and creating a fruit salad, learning how to chop safely

Year 3—have been learning about structures, how to make 3D shapes and using struts to sturdy a structure, ending with a stone age shelter Year 4—have been learning about the process of making bread and then designing a savoury or sweet roll for a Roman soldier

Year 5—have been learning about the eat well plate, designing a healthy meal

Year 6 will be catching up with their DT work later on in the year.

We hope that this week has re-immersed the children in their STAR learning.


