Informing us is so important, as otherwise it is recorded as unauthorised and this can lead to local authority involvement. 



Funded Places this Easter at Mega Camps

We at Mega Camps are pleased to announce that we are once again working with Kent Council and The Education People on the Holiday Activity and Food Programme (HAF) this Easter School Holiday 2023.

This program enables children eligible for **benefits-related** free school meals and also children classified as vulnerable to attend our Dartford Mega Camps location this Easter. The funding allows each child to attend for a total of 4 half days and is **completely funded for them**. Lunches, Snacks, Drinks, and endless activities will be provided to give these children the best experience possible.



We only have a limited number of these places available this Easter Holiday so please feel free to email out the below information to parents as soon as possible for children that are eligible. It explains to parents below how they go about booking their child onto this program with us.
