Dear Parents/Carers,

Hope you enjoyed the long Coronation weekend.

### KS2 SATS

This week, children in Year 6 have been taking part in their KS2 SATs assessments. These assessments have been carried out each morning and assess their understanding and skills in grammar and spelling, reading, arithmetic and mathematical reasoning. They have been a tricky set of assessments this year but the children have coped with them extremely well. We could not be prouder of how they have approached each of them, showing that they are true Craylearners by taking risks and not worrying about mistakes they may have made.

The school does not receive the results until July; the children will receive the results when they get their end of year reports. Whatever the outcomes, we know that after weeks of revision, they have done their best.

### KS1 SATS

Next week, children in Year 2 will take part in their SATS assessments. These will be carried out in small groups and there will be a number of adults available to support the children. These assessments support the teachers in a teacher assessment for the end of KS1, which again is shared when the reports are sent out at the end of the year. There is certainly nothing for the children to worry about with these. We know that they are working as hard as they can to make as much progress as possible.

#### Mobile phones

There have been a number of incidents whereby younger children have had mobile phones in school. Unlike Year 6 who understand that if they bring a phone in, they must hand it into the office at the beginning of the school day and collect at the end, the younger children have had the phones in their bags.

There is no reason why any of our younger children need to have a mobile phone with them, however if your child does need one to communicate with you at the end of the day for some reason, please can you ensure that they hand it into the office so that it can be kept safe during the day and does not pose a safeguarding risk being in a classroom.

## Communicating through the gates

We have noticed a few times whereby parents/carers have spoken to their child or tried to through the KS2 playground gate during the school day. Please do not do this—you must go to the school office if you need to make contact or hand something in rather than talk to your child through the gates. Staff will ask you to stop if they see you doing this and have every right to as well.

#### **Smartwatches**

Please can we ask that the children do not wear watches which have the capability of taking photos—it would appear that this looks possible on some of the watches we have seen; it poses a safeguarding risk if someone was to try to take images of others during the school day. Many thanks.




