Dear Parents/Carers,

What a scorcher of a week it has been!

### <u>Weather</u>

As I already alluded to, it has been very hot in school this week, however it has been cooler outside than in. Please ensure your child has their water bottle with them every day. Your child may also wear a sunhat at break and lunchtimes. We do ask that children do not wear sunglasses, unless they help with hayfever. Please ensure you apply sun cream to your child before school; if they can apply it themselves in school, they can bring it in but MUST let their teacher know they have it in their bag and should not let anyone else use it.

### <u>Parking</u>

I met with a couple of the local residents and a couple of members of the local council this week to discuss the concerns around the use of the roads surrounding the school. It was a positive meeting with everyone wanting the safety of the children to be the priority. The residents do not object to cars using the local roads but would ask for them to be used considerably, to ensure that emergency vehicles can access them if needed. I have sent out a separate newsletter related to this, highlighting some of the areas that I hope you can help with. I will also send out a survey related to parking which I would be grateful if you could complete when I do so.

### <u>Insects</u>

This week, we have had cases where staff and children have been affected by contact through insects. As the weather has become hotter, the children are now on the field and some of them accessing the meadow area, there have been incidents of rashes on the body in reaction to contact and insects being found on the skin as well.

We would encourage you to check your child after school and if you do find that your child has any rashes or anything on them that they should not relating to insects/ bites etc then please do let us know so we can monitor this closely. We would particularly encourage Year 2 parents/carers on forest school day to check this is either a Tuesday or Thursday.

### Morning clubs

We are noticing that there are children arriving for morning clubs earlier than they start. Both HERO club and Mr Ellen's early morning sports game start at 8am and you should wait for either Mrs Drake/Mrs Farrell or Mr Ellen to let you in. I think some children are getting in via West Hill Life—there is no one supervising the children when this happens so please do not drop your child off earlier than 8am. Many thanks.
