It was great to see so many of you at our meet the teacher sessions this week. We will endeavour to send out copies of the presentations for those who could not attend so that you know the information that was shared.

EYFS

Next week, our youngest members of the school will start full days. This means that they should come through the gate in the morning by 8.45am with all of the other children. They will then be collected at the same gate at 3.15pm in the afternoon. Be prepared for them to be very tired as jumping from mornings to a whole day can be tiring for them but they will soon adjust to it.

A big thank you to all of the parents/carers who attended the EYFS phonics sessions this week—we hope that you found it useful in understanding how we teach reading at Craylands.

Awards

Last year, Mrs Cox, one of our Assistant Heads, worked extremely hard on developing our approach to anti-bullying in line with the criteria set by the United Against Bullying (UAB) programme. She worked hard on improving our procedures, staff and children's understanding of the different types of bullying and had to submit a wide range of evidence.

I am very pleased to announce that all her hard work managed to secure a 'Silver' award. They stated....

This is not an easy award programme and you should be incredibly proud of what you have achieved! For context, we had 331 schools complete the programme with only 2% achieving Gold, 14% Silver, 71% Bronze and 12% a certificate of participation.

A big thank you to Mrs Cox and to all of the children, staff and parents for helping to achieve this award. We will continue our work on antibullying throughout the year.

Each year, Craylands provide lots of sporting opportunities for the children to take part in including football matches, cross country running, Futsal, athletics and a range of sporting clubs. In recognition of this we have been awarded a 'Bronze' Sports Mark Award. A big thank you to Mr Ellen for submitting the evidence and supporting the school in achieving this award.

TTRS

A big thank you to all the parents/carers who have supported their children in playing on Times Tables Rockstars this week as part of their home learning. As a result of my gentle reminder earlier in the week to those who had not played, we had another 83 more children play....that's a great increase and your support is much appreciated. Overall we had 223 children playing on TTRS this week. Let's see if we can beat that next week!

Next week, we look forward to celebrating the school's 20th year anniversary with a range of activities for the children including steel pans, gospel choir, an inflatable assault course and ending with a picnic and the burial of a time capsule that each class will add something to. It promises to be a special week indeed.


