With just two weeks left of term, it seems to be flying past!

20th Anniversary Fayre

Well what an event Saturday was! I am sure that those of you who attended would agree that it was a busy day and was such a great turn out from the local community—a big thank you to the Mayor of Swanscombe for opening the event also.

None of it could have happened without the planning, preparation and organization of the 'Friends' of Craylands' - a dedicated group of parents/carers and staff members who really arranged an amazing event to culminate the celebration of 20 years of Craylands.

A huge thank you to everyone who supported and ran a stall on the day itself—thank you to the parents/carers who gave up their family time to run the event and to those staff members who gave up their Saturday to set up, run inflatables and stalls and tidy up afterwards. A huge team effort!

I am absolutely delighted to share with you that after deducting costs and expenses for the day itself, the day made a HUGE £3731.69—this far exceeds the amount we raised at the last summer fair we held. The Friends of Craylands will be donating this money to help fund coach costs for future school trips, as well as contributing towards the end of year school event for Year 6. Thank you once again for all who came and to the Friends of Craylands.

Christmas fair '22: I can also now share with you that the joint effort between the Pupil & Parent Support Team and the Friends of Craylands at the Christmas Fair in December 2022, raised £1547.49 for the school. Another great fundraising event.

We look forward to more events planned for the year ahead.

TTRS/Numbots: A big thank you to all the parents/carers who have supported their children in playing on Times Tables Rockstars this week as part of their home learning. Overall we had 230 children playing on TTRS this week an increase of 4 children than last week. Lots did not play in year 2 this week so it would be good to see more of year 2 playing please.

Number - We have been categorizing groups, comparing using the language of more and fewer and combining groups to find out how many we have altogether.


Literacy - Phonemes g o c k have been taught and the corresponding letter formation sheets are coming home for practice.
