<u>Year 1 trip</u>

On Tuesday, I had the privilege of attending the Year 1 trip to Kent Life. The children took part in a workshop whereby they looked at the vegetables and herbs growing in the garden and then learnt how to prepare them to be added to a soup—peeling and chopping with a knife. These were then cooked and the children were given a pot of soup to take home. We hope that they enjoyed eating them.

The children also had an opportunity to see the different animals in the farm and visit the old houses, looking at the objects from the past they have been learning about such as a mangle. Throughout the trip, the children were impeccably well behaved and were very engaged also. A big thank you to Mrs Turpie for arranging the trip for Year 1 and to the adults who accompanied the children on the day.


<u>Field</u>

Thank you for taking part in the Summer Term Challenge with the BetterPoints App!

Behaving in ways beneficial for our health and the planet should be effortless. This summer Ebbsfleet Development Corporation has partnered with BetterPoints and local schools in Ebbsfleet to encourage healthy and sustainable choices to be made on the school run.

Throughout the Summer Term, we are encouraging all students, parents, carers, teachers and staff to participate in our 'Lets Clean Up The School Run!' challenge, leaving vehicles at home and choosing healthier and more sustainable modes of transport. Walking to school is a healthy and enjoyable way to start the day. Not only is it beneficial for your health and wellbeing, it's also a benefit to your community and the planet.

HERE'S HOW IT WORKS

Participants simply need to download the BetterPoints App (available on Google Play and the Apple Store). Users must be aged 14 or over, so students under the age of 14 will need to have their parent or carer track activity via their phones.

Downloading and using the BetterPoints App is free for anyone wanting to take part. Once downloaded, users will need to ensure that tracking is on, and BetterPoints will do the rest!

HOW LONG DOES THE CHALLENGE RUN FOR?

The challenge will take place throughout the Summer Term (not including May half term holiday) with activity monitored 22nd April to 19th July 2024.

HOW IS ACTIVITY MONITORED?

Anyone who signs up and uses the app Monday -Friday at school drop off and pick up times, within a 0.2-mile radius of your school, will contribute to your school's leader board.

The three schools with the highest numbers of parents and staff who have signed up to take part and recorded an activity, compared to the number of pupils that attend the school, can win a prize.

It's all about the number of people who take part, so encourage as many of your friends, family members and fellow students as you can to join in! Even the smallest school could win a prize!



Download BetterPoints & get tracking!

- 1. Visit Google Play or The Apple Store to download the free BetterPoints App.
- 2. Sign up using the referral code 'ebbsfleetschools24'.
- 3. Select your school and get ready for the challenge.
- 4. If you already have the BetterPoints app, head to the menu button, add the code and go to the 'challenges' area.
- 5. Find the 'Get Active in Ebbsfleet Schools Challenge' and select join.
- 6. Select your school and get ready for the challenge!

How do I record my activities?

To record your activities, switch your tracking to on and start earning points towards your school leader board.

How does my school win a prize?

It's all about the number of parents, guardians and staff who take part, so encourage as many people as you can to sign up and join in with active travel! You can track your school's progress on the leader board. Come the end of the challenge, if you and your fellow parents, guardians and staff are at the top of the leader board the following prizes will be awarded:

- 1st Prize a visit to the school from award winning theatre company 'Histrionics'
- 2nd Prize £250 to be spent on gardening or sports equipment or resources to encourage active travel
- 3rd Prize £150 to be spent on gardening or sports equipment or resources to encourage active travel

Can I win any prizes as an individual?

Yes! By walking, wheeling, cycling, or scooting to and from school as much as possible! Every weekday morning between 7am – 10am and afternoon 2pm – 6pm you can earn BetterPoints and BetterTickets for individual prize draws.

How is the winner calculated?

The leader board is scored as a percentage of participants that take part based on the size of the school, to ensure that schools of all sizes have a fair chance of winning. It's all about the number of students, parents, guardians and staff who take part, so encourage as many people as you can to join in!

What is the BetterPoints App?

BetterPoints is an award-winning behaviour change technology company that helps people improve their own health and that of the wider community. Their vision is to create local self-supporting challenges that deliver sustainability, carbon reduction, improved self-health and social care, as well as community cohesion.

What are BetterPoints?

BetterPoints are a financially backed currency that you can redeem for high street vouchers or give to your favourite charity or community group (1,000 BetterPoints is equivalent to \pm 1.). BetterTickets give you entry into prize draws. If you haven't done so already, make sure you join the Get Active in Ebbsfleet main challenge for the chance to win a lot more points of tickets for getting active!

What can I spend my points on?

Points can be redeemed for a variety of high-street vouchers. You can check what is available by tapping Rewards on the bottom navigation bar of your app. You can also give your points to charities and community groups, including a number of local causes too.

What type of activity counts?

Any recorded walking, wheeling, cycling, or scooting activities during the morning and afternoon school run will count towards winning individual prizes.

Can pupils use the app?

To use the BetterPoints app you must be 14 years of age and over. This restriction is in line with the Children's Online Privacy Protection Act (COPPA), which protects every child under the age of 13.

Can I take part if I am in a wheelchair or mobility scooter, and if so, how do I record my journeys?

Yes! All kinds of wheelchairs and mobility scooters can be tracked as 'wheeling' in the app. Your app will automatically track your journey. Due to the motion sensors inbuilt in your device, and the algorithms in the app, it may assume you are cycling, rather than using a wheelchair or mobility scooter. In your timeline, after completing your journey you will be able to amend this to wheeling and your journey will be updated.

If the challenge has already started, can I still join in?

Yes! You can register to take part at any time during the challenge.

How does Automatic Tracking work?

The app monitors movement of the phone and will start registering a movement when the device has moved a significant distance. Once recording, waypoints are uploaded to the server as you move. Activities like walking around your home will not be picked up. Once an activity is registered as complete, BetterPoints or BetterTickets can be applied to it.
